Rat Alert – there are high numbers of Rats about at the moment

Rats carry over 45 different diseases

To Man ie. Salmonella / Typhoid / Dysentry etc

To Animals ie. Aujeskys disease / Foot and mouth / Brucellosis

50% of rats carry pathogens in their urine ... One rat leaves 25,000 droppings per year

One pair of rats can produce a colony of 2,000 in a year

A group of rats is called a mischief

Nearly 50% of all farm fires caused by rodents!

Rodents cause over £25 Million damage each year on farms

NB – In order to purchase Rat Bait you need to have either valid Farm Assurance or hold an appropriate Rodent Control Qualification.

Hmmm... Where do we go from here? What resolutions do we need to make?

- Walk crops with your agronomist and identify which crops can be salvaged and how they will be managed, which crops will really respond and need investing in and which to re-plant
- This year more than any other sit down with your agronomist and work out Gross Margins, cost of production and how you can get the best from the crops you have in the ground
- The grain market (current and futures) has strengthened so speak to your grain buyer and keep in the market where possible
- Look at local demand for alternative spring crops (especially if everyone else loads up with Spring Barley) Is there a demand for maize (and crimped grain maize...), pulses, beet, lucerne or other products locally?
- Use the opportunity to cost effectively take out persistent weed issues in fields that are currently uncropped

Currently these are about as much as anyone can do with conditions as they are.
